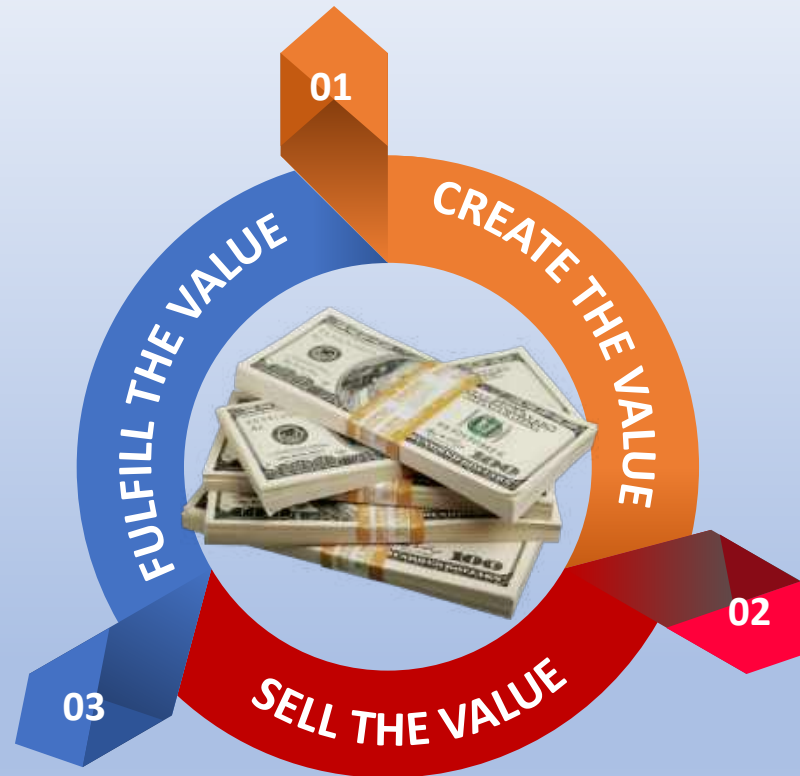

TAKE HEED WHAT YOU HEAR...

- *“For with the same measure you use, it will be measured back to you.”* (Mark 4:24)
- *“Take heed (see, visualize, translate from audible to visual, watch and discern) what you hear (give audience to). With the same measure (level of attention, depth and importance you attach to what you’re hearing), it will be measured back to you (given back to you with the same level of importance and intensity and depth); and to you who hear (intently pay attention), more (an increasing measure of insight, understanding and revelation) will be given.”*
- *“Take heed” is most often translated as “see”.*
- Habakkuk said (Habakkuk 2:1) *“I will stand my watch and set myself on the rampart, And **WATCH TO SEE WHAT HE WILL SAY** to me, And what I will answer when I am corrected.*

MONK METHOD

- **Can be loosely traced back to Irenaeus (disciple of Polycarp, disciple of John, disciple of Jesus)**
- **Reading:** The monk would slowly and attentively read a passage of scripture, focusing on the words and allowing them to sink in.
- **Meditation:** After reading, the monk would meditate on the passage, reflecting deeply on its meaning and implications. During this stage, the monk would engage the imagination by visualizing the scenes described in the scripture, imagining themselves as part of the narrative, or contemplating the symbolic meanings of the text. (Bring in the senses.)
- **Prayer:** The monk would then enter into a dialogue with God, using the insights and emotions stirred by the meditation to guide their prayer. This could involve expressing praise, seeking guidance, or asking for strength.
- **Contemplation:** Finally, the monk would rest in God's presence, allowing the mind to quiet and simply be with the Lord. This stage is about experiencing God's presence without the need for words or active thought, allowing the meditation and imagination to lead to a deeper connection with the spiritual.

Belief comes...

- Belief comes by hearing (by what we give audience to) and what we give audience to, comes from **what we “see”** and perceive.
- Seeing is the spark that occurs when the sperm enters the egg and life begins.
- It's CONCEPTION. What you can “see” and believe, you can achieve!
- We need that SPARK that enables sight (SEEING) because seeing is the conception of belief and belief changes or motivates certain behavior and behavior determines results. And results make possible the REWARDS we desire.
- But “SEEING” springs out of...

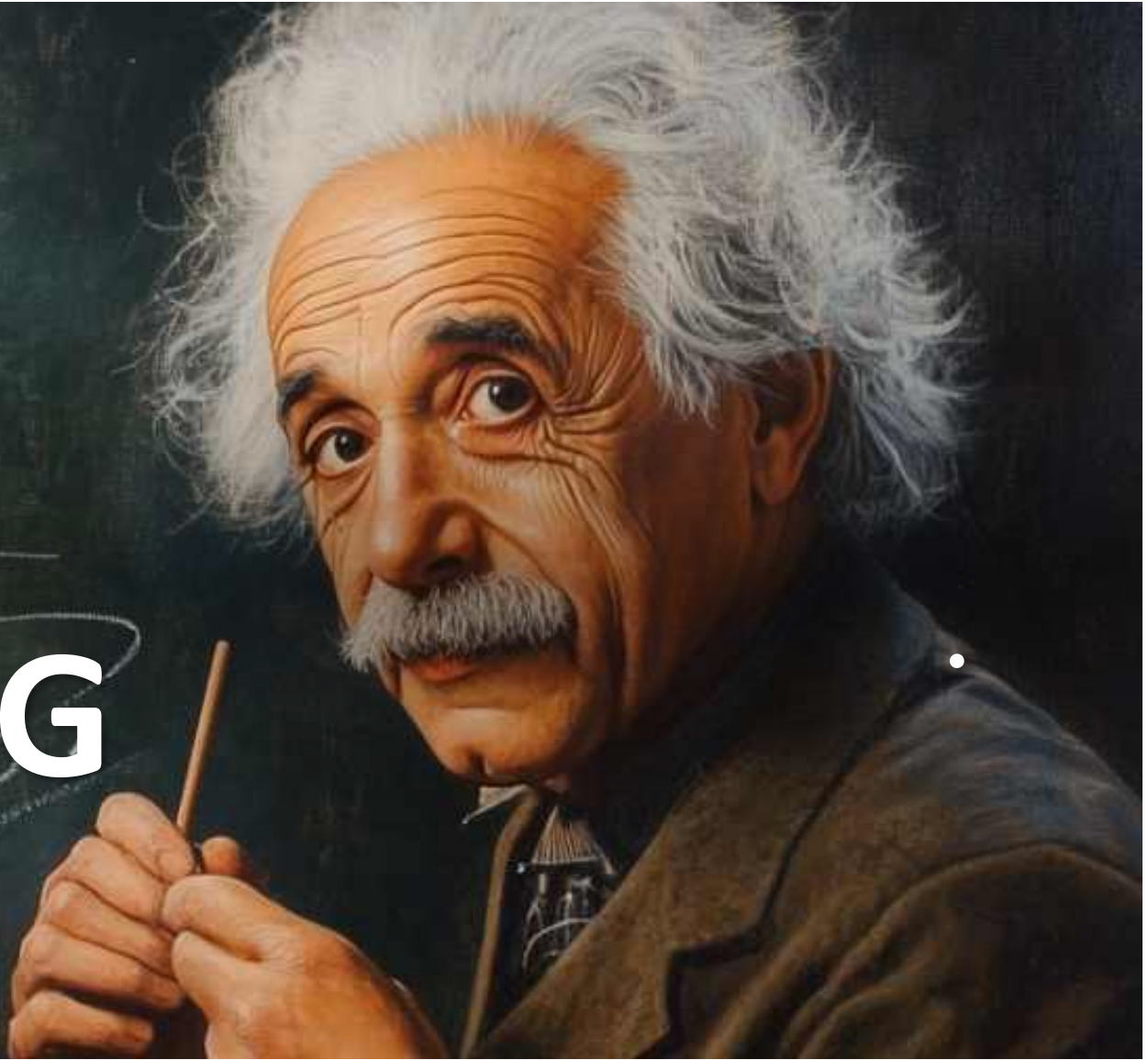

7-Step Thinking Framework

- Be observant. Pay attention to surroundings. (Franklin, DaVinci, Solomon)
- Have childlike curiosity (Einstein, DaVinci, Carver)
- Ask God for wisdom, revelation, knowledge and understanding (Solomon, Carver, Paul)
- Ask questions (Franklin) - What aren't you asking and why (Greg Moyer)
- Use your imagination as a tool (Einstein on a ray of light)
- Practice synthesis and interdisciplinary thinking (Franklin, DaVinci, Carver)
- Experiment, test and document (Franklin, Einstein, Edison, Carver)

THREE DESTINATIONS OF INPUT

Body / Physical Input: What you eat and drink. Exercise. Breathe (i.e. clean air)

Soul: What you feed your mind, intellect. From these things, your heart will be either nourished, diminished or ignored (disconnected). Your emotions flow out of your thought life. Who do you follow, listen to, pay attention to? What do you watch? Where do you set your eyes? To what do you tune your ears? What do you make a point of observing? What do you read? Does it contribute to your goals and quality of life or is it only idle amusement?

Spirit: Feed your spirit with the Word and with worship. Soak in His Presence. Wait on the Lord. Receive from Him what He speaks to your heart. There are dark forces of negative energy and depression. Choose life instead.

TWO TYPES OF INPUT

- Voluntary (chosen)
 - Coaches, consultants, teachers, courses, etc.
- Involuntary (imposed)
 - Parents, especially during childhood
 - Schooling
- “Do not be deceived: Evil company corrupts good habits” (ethos / character.) 1 Corinthians 15:33
- Evil company gives you bad input. Bad input will corrupt the good things in your life. This is a stark warning against evil company.
- Bad company isn’t limited to your old drinking buddy, who’s always trying to get you to become like them. Sometimes bad company is your favorite TV show or a website that corrupts good habits.
- There is an INPUT Battle raging in America (everywhere) where opposing forces are vying for your attention to get you to CONSUME THEIR INPUT. They know that the decisions you make are based on the INPUT YOU CONSUME. It’s WHERE IT ALL STARTS!!!
