Time to Complete: 25–30 Minutes

THE PURPOSE OF THIS ACTIVATION

Provision is not random.

God is the **Source**, but He frequently provides through designs, systems, people, opportunities, work, relationships, wisdom, value exchange, stewardship, seasons, and participation.

That changes the question.

Instead of simply asking:

“God, where is my provision?”

Begin asking:

“GOD, WHERE HAVE YOU ALREADY DESIGNED PROVISION—AND HOW AM I SUPPOSED TO PARTICIPATE?”

This activation will help you identify:

- what God has already given you,
- what opportunity may already be present,
- what value you can create,
- what stewardship may be required,
- and what action you can take now.

STEP 1 — REESTABLISH THE SOURCE

Suggested time: 3 minutes

Provision begins with God.

But God being your Source does not mean money simply appears without channels, participation, or responsibility.

Think about your present situation.

Where am I currently feeling the greatest need for provision?

What am I tempted to view as my “source”?

A customer? Employer? Contract? Bank account? Person? Opportunity? Sale?

Now complete this statement:

“That may be a CHANNEL of provision, but my Source is...”

GOD.

What changes in your thinking when you make that distinction?

STEP 2 — INVENTORY WHAT GOD HAS ALREADY PROVIDED

Suggested time: 5 minutes

Provision often begins **before the need appears**.

God may have already placed resources around you that you have not recognized as provision.

Take a quick inventory.

What has God already placed in my hands?

Think beyond money.

GIFTS / ABILITIES

KNOWLEDGE / EXPERIENCE

RELATIONSHIPS / CONNECTIONS

TOOLS / RESOURCES / ASSETS

IDEAS / INSIGHTS / WISDOM

STEP 3 — IDENTIFY YOUR ASSIGNMENT

Suggested time: 4 minutes

Provision follows purpose.

A bird is equipped for a bird's assignment.

A flower is equipped for its assignment.

You have also been designed and equipped for something.

Who am I presently called to serve?

What problem am I especially equipped to help solve?

What result can I help create for them?

If you are unclear about the assignment, provision can appear confusing because you may be looking for resources without knowing what those resources are meant to support.

STEP 4 — FIND THE OPPORTUNITY HIDING INSIDE THE NEED

Suggested time: 4 minutes

Provision often appears as **opportunity**.

And opportunity frequently appears disguised as:

- a problem
- a complaint
- a frustration
- a need
- an inefficiency
- a question
- an assignment
- a request for help

Think about the people or marketplace around you.

What problem do I keep seeing?

Who is experiencing that problem?

What are they already trying to accomplish?

Now ask:

WHAT IF THIS PROBLEM ISN'T INTERRUPTING MY ASSIGNMENT?

WHAT IF IT IS REVEALING MY OPPORTUNITY?

The opportunity I may have been overlooking is:

STEP 5 — TURN OPPORTUNITY INTO VALUE

Suggested time: 4 minutes

Business becomes one channel of provision when you **create value for someone else** and value is exchanged.

Don't begin with:

“How can I make more money?”

Begin with:

“HOW CAN I CREATE MORE VALUE?”

Choose the opportunity you identified.

What could I DO, CREATE, IMPROVE, TEACH, SOLVE, BUILD, OR DELIVER that would make life or business better for this person?

What specific value would they receive?

Why would that value matter enough for someone to exchange something for it?

Now complete:

STEP 6 — CHECK YOUR PARTICIPATION

Suggested time: 3 minutes

God provides. But provision frequently requires participation. Consider these activities:

Are you...

- observing?
- learning?
- asking?
- building?
- serving?
- creating?
- contacting people?
- presenting an offer?
- following up?
- solving problems?
- working?
- implementing what you already know?

Where might I currently be asking God to do something He has already given ME responsibility to participate in?

One action I know I should already be taking is:

STEP 7 — RUN THE STEWARDSHIP TEST

Suggested time: 3 minutes

Provision creates responsibility. Before asking for more, examine how you are handling what has already been entrusted to you.

What resource has God already given me that needs better stewardship?

- time
- relationships
- knowledge
- opportunities
- customers
- abilities
- ideas
- influence
- systems

STEP 8 — IDENTIFY YOUR SEASON

Suggested time: 2 minutes

Provision operates in seasons.

Not every season looks like harvest.

You may currently be in a season of:

PLANTING — GROWING — PREPARING — HARVESTING — RESTORING

Do not judge a planting season by harvest-season measurements.

STEP 9 — THE TRUST QUESTION

Suggested time: 2 minutes

Provision requires trust.

Trust does not mean inactivity.

It means faithfully doing your part while trusting God with what you cannot control.

What part of my provision situation CAN I control?

What part must I entrust to God?

STEP 10 — THE 72-HOUR PROVISION ACTIVATION

Suggested time: 3–5 minutes

Do not finish this assignment merely believing differently.

Participate differently.

Within the next **72 hours**, take one concrete action that aligns with God's provision design.

It might mean:

- contacting a potential customer
- offering to solve a problem
- creating something valuable
- following up on an opportunity

- improving an offer
- asking someone how you can serve them
- using an underutilized gift
- applying knowledge you already possess
- stewarding an existing resource better
- planting something that can produce later
- giving generously
- taking a step you have been waiting for God to take for you
